Matthew 6:9-13

"This, then, is how you should pray:

*"Our Father in heaven,
hallowed be your name,
10 your kingdom come,
your will be done,
on earth as it is in heaven.*

11 Give us today our daily bread.

*12 And forgive us our debts,
as we also have forgiven our debtors.*

*13 And lead us not into temptation,
but deliver us from the evil one.*

The Lord's Prayer found in Matthew chapter six is more than words to be ritualistically repeated. It is a mandate that we, as believers, are called to live by. The words of Jesus, 'your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven,' represent our purpose here on earth. The prophetic vision for Newsoul in 2024 is **'YOUR KINGDOM COME.'** When God's kingdom enters into our lives, our families, our city, our business, etc., miracles become normal, breakthroughs flow naturally, and impossibilities become possible. FASTING

In 2024, as a church, we are embarking on a twelve-day fast together, dedicating one day to represent each month of the year. This booklet contains specific prayer points for each month, allowing you to focus on a particular theme every day during the fast. For instance, on day one of the fast, pray through the January prayer points, and continue in sequence each day. Let's anticipate that this season of fasting and prayer will set the tone for the year, awakening the spirit of revival and renewal within us!

DANIEL FAST

Focus on consuming only fruits and vegetables. You can be creative with your cooking and preparation.

SABBATH FAST

Abstain from all food and drink only water (or juice if needed) until sundown every day.

CONSECRATION FAST

The idea is to consecrate, or set apart, yourself and your plans to God. Abstain from food and luxuries like social media.

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03 **MARCH** *YOUR KINGDOM COME IN MY JOB/SCHOOL*

- Pray for your boss/teachers or those in authority (wisdom, leadership, favor, etc.).
- Pray for three co-workers/schoolmates to come to know Jesus and invite them to church.
- Pray for the growth and blessing in your job/school.

04 **APRIL** ***YOUR KINGDOM COME IN MY NEIGHBORHOOD***

- Pray for the needs of your neighbors.
 - Pray for three individual neighbors to come to the Lord and invite them to church.
 - Pray for the specific needs of your area of town (crime, violence, apathy, etc.).
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05 **MAY** ***YOUR KINGDOM COME IN ABQ***

- Pray for the significant needs of Albuquerque (poverty, crime, violence, etc.).
 - Pray for our mayor and city council.
 - Pray for the local churches in Albuquerque.
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06 **JUNE** ***YOUR KINGDOM COME IN NEW MEXICO***

- Pray for spiritual revival in New Mexico.
 - Pray for our state government and leaders.
 - Pray for the prosperity of businesses throughout the state.
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07 **JULY** ***YOUR KINGDOM COME IN THE USA***

- Pray for revival to sweep across the USA.
 - Pray for righteousness and justice in our nation.
 - Pray for the political powers and decision-makers in our nation.
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08 **AUGUST** ***YOUR KINGDOM COME ON EARTH***

- Pray for global missions and the advancement of the gospel.
- Pray for the global church to thrive and experience revival.
- Pray for the persecuted church around the world.

MATTHEW 1:1

This is the genealogy of Jesus the Messiah the son of David, the son of Abraham

The story of Jesus begins with a genealogy. Many of Jesus' ancestors were remarkable men and women of faith, while others were murderers, thieves, and individuals of questionable character. The significance of our lives isn't determined by our past or our family tree. You can emerge from a broken and sinful past and still have a God-ordained purpose in your future.

MATTHEW 3:17

And a voice from heaven said, " This is my Son, whom I love; with him I am well pleased."

Jesus had not yet performed a single miracle, saved a single soul, or even begun his ministry when the Father uttered the words, "This is my son, whom I love; with him, I am well pleased." The Father's approval and love for us aren't based on our performance or production but on our status as His sons and daughters. He loves you and is pleased with you.

MATTHEW 5:23-24

"Therefore, if you are offering your gift at the altar and there remember that your brother or sister has something against you, leave your gift there in front of the altar. First go and be reconciled to them; then come and offer your gift.

Worship requires clean hands and a pure heart. You cannot truly worship while carrying bitterness, hurt, and unforgiveness. Sometimes, the door to worship will only open once you have undergone the process of repentance and reconciliation.

Wanting to satisfy the crowd, Pilate released Barabbas to them. He had Jesus flogged, and handed him over to be crucified.

Jesus was crucified in the place of a common criminal named Barabbas. This holds profound prophetic significance. The name Barabbas is Hebrew for 'son of the father' (bar=son of, Abba=father). Jesus took our place on the cross so that we could become 'Barabbas'—sons and daughters of the Father. You were set free from the penalty of your sins when Jesus died in your stead. What an amazing Savior we have!

Very truly I tell you, whoever hears my word and believes him who sent me has eternal life and will not be judged but has crossed over from death to life.

Eternal life does not commence at our demise, but rather at the moment we believe. When we place our faith in Jesus, we transition from death to life. Judgment passes over us because of the blood of Christ. To believe is not merely mental agreement; genuine belief is reflected in our actions. For instance, I believe that when I press the brakes in my car, I will stop. This belief alters the way I drive. If I did not believe my brakes would stop me, I would never drive my car. True belief transforms your mind, heart, actions, and lifestyle.

Aware that his disciples were grumbling about this,
Jesus said to them, "Does this offend you?"

Everywhere I look, I encounter people who are easily offended. They're offended by their parents, spouses, bosses, the government, or even strangers on the internet – it appears that someone is offended about something all the time. You cannot be a Jesus follower and remain offended. If you find yourself offended you have drifted from the cross and are in danger of the very fires of hell! You may think that is extreme, but do you know what caused Judas to betray Jesus... he was offended.

**"I'm going out to fish," Simon Peter told them, and they said, "We'll go with you.
" So they went out and got into the boat, but that night they caught nothing.**

When Jesus found Peter and some of the other disciples, they were fishermen, which was their life before Christ. In moments of failure, frustration, and disappointment, Peter and the other disciples returned to their old way of life. Pressure reveals what's in our hearts. In your moments of pressure, do you find yourself wanting to revert to the old you? If you have left that old life behind, leave it behind forever.

ACTS 1:11

"Men of Galilee," they said, "why do you stand here looking into the sky? This same Jesus, who has been taken from you into heaven, will come back in the same way you have seen him go into heaven."

In the same way he ascended he will descend. The second coming of Jesus is the great hope of the Christian faith. Unfortunately, we don't hear enough teaching and preaching on His second coming. Jesus is truly coming back. His first coming was that of a suffering servant, but His second coming will be as the King of Kings and Lord of Lords. As Christians, we are called to live every day as though the coming of the Lord is imminent. If Jesus were to return today, would you be ready?

ACTS 2:2-4

Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them.

The significant gift that Jesus left behind at His ascension was the infilling of the third person in the Trinity, the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit serves many crucial roles in the life of a believer: Comforter, Counselor, Bestower of spiritual gifts, Communicator with us, and Empowerer for a supernatural life, among others. Never take for granted the gift of the Holy Spirit!

They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer.

This verse outlines four central roles of the Christian church. First is the teaching of God's word, second is community, third is the administration of the sacraments (communion and baptism to remember the cross and resurrection), and finally prayer. A healthy church needs all four of these things to remain relevant to both God and man.

There is a counter-cultural element to Christianity that is simply unavoidable. The Christian faith often finds itself in direct conflict with culture, and at times, even with religion. In our desire to remain culturally relevant, we must not dilute the Gospel of salvation. While the gospel can be controversial at times, it also possesses life-changing power. If we water down the gospel, the life-changing power diminishes along with it.

Romans is commonly referred to as Paul's great theological masterpiece. The primary message of the letter Paul wrote to the Christians of Rome is salvation by grace alone through faith. Salvation, peace with God, eternal life, healing, and forgiveness are all free gifts of God's grace. Somehow, our faith mysteriously lays hold of these free gifts, and we receive the complete and total work of grace in our lives.

And do not present your members as instruments of unrighteousness to sin, but present yourselves to God as being alive from the dead, and your members as instruments of righteousness to God.

What I did not understand was that when He died on the cross, I also died, but when He rose from the dead, I also rose from the dead. The Bible is clear that God calls and uses women as spiritual leaders. In this one chapter, Paul lists Phoebe as a deacon, Priscilla as a pastor of a home church, and Junia as an apostle (the highest position in church leadership). Women, do not allow anyone to diminish God's calling on your life. You come from a great lineage of strong female spiritual leaders, such as Phoebe, Priscilla, and Junia!

know that a person is not justified by the works of the law, but by faith in Jesus Christ. So we, too, have put our faith in Christ Jesus that we may be justified by faith in Christ and not by the works of the law, because by the works of the law no one will be justified.

The heart of the book of Galatians centers on salvation and the means by which a person is saved. In Paul's time, some preachers were teaching that in order to be saved, one had to follow the Old Testament law and essentially become Jewish. Paul, in this letter, passionately defends the truth of the Gospel: that salvation comes by grace through faith. For us, this is incredibly good news! Religion cannot save, human efforts cannot save, but faith in Christ has the power to save even the worst of sinners!

For you were once darkness, but now you are light in the Lord. Walk as children of light.

Notice that this verse does not say that we are 'in the light,' but 'are light.' The gospel is so powerful that it doesn't merely change our status but our very nature. My nature shifted from darkness to light when I encountered Jesus. Light now permeates every cell of my body, soul, and spirit. The gospel genuinely transforms lives! It doesn't merely alter actions or behaviors but our very nature. We are truly new creations in Christ Jesus.

Hebrews eleven is the great chapter on faith. This verse stands out to me. Saying these people died without receiving the promised things seems a little discouraging at first glance, but this shows us what great faith actually looks like. Men like Abraham had such great faith and promises that there was no way to see the fulfillment in their lifetime. I want so much faith that the things I believe for cannot be accomplished in my lifetime. I want faith so great that my promises pass on to my children and my children's children. Faith so great that it has ripple effects in the generations to come.

JAM 1:4

But let patience have its perfect work, that you may be perfect and complete, lacking nothing.

"The book of James is often called the Proverbs of the New Testament. It's a book full of wisdom and insight. This verse tells me that patience leads to perfection. I am not a very patient person, which means I am far from perfect. Learning to be patient is a painful practice because it requires being placed in opportunities that can easily make us frustrated. If you are frustrated in your current circumstances maybe it can become an opportunity to become perfected through patience.

JAM 4:4

You adulterous people, don't you know that friendship with the world means enmity against God? Therefore, anyone who chooses to be a friend of the world becomes an enemy of God.

James seems to be a strong preacher! Here he compares friendship with the world to adultery. When James speaks of the world, he is not referring to God's good creation, but the corrupt systems of sin that penetrate culture, politics, entertainment, education, etc. Any thought or action that is contrary to God and his word is considered 'worldly.' I want to be a friend of God who carries His thoughts, His love, and His actions. We can be transformed as friends of God through the renewing of the mind and the washing of the word.

One thing will lead to the next, and before you know it, you are climbing the ladder of spiritual success.

If anyone ever asks you, 'How can I know that Jesus loves me?' show them this verse! Jesus has already proven His love for us. His love led Him to the cross. He gave His life for us because He loves us!

The Bible teaches us that in the last days, false prophets will arise to deceive people. How do you know if something is a false prophet? This verse tells us. First, anyone who denies that Jesus is Lord is a false prophet. Second, if someone teaches a Jesus that is different from the Jesus of the Bible, that person is a false prophet. Good and true preachers and teachers focus on Jesus and the good news of what He has done for us! I would avoid listening to preachers who rarely or never mention Jesus.

REV 1:1

The Revelation from Jesus Christ, which God gave him to show his servants what must soon take place. He made it known by sending his angel to his servant John.

The book of Revelation is meant to be good news and encouraging to the body of Christ. Any interpretation of the book of Revelation that makes believers afraid of the Second Coming of Jesus should be avoided. Revelation is the story of God's final judgment of evil and the salvation of His church from the wickedness and evils of this world. As a follower of Jesus, you should not fear His coming, but pray for it to come quickly! His second coming means the end of suffering, the end of evil, and the salvation of the church. Come, Lord Jesus!

REV 2:7

Whoever has ears, let them hear what the Spirit says to the churches. To the one who is victorious, I will give the right to eat from the tree of life, which is in the paradise of God.

God's ultimate plan for humanity is a return to an Eden-like existence. We were created to walk with God, talk with God, and eat from the tree of life. This is the promise God gives to those who overcome the struggles and temptations of this life.

REV 21:1

Then I saw “a new heaven and a new earth,” for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away, and there was no longer any sea.

Most people think of heaven as an escape from earth, far out in the sky. That view is actually not biblical. The biblical view is of a redeemed heavens and earth that become one, a new heaven and earth.
